# 1 What's New

CPS 10g Release 3 (10.1.3.3.5) includes the following new features and enhancements compared to earlier 10gR3 releases:

### **Additional WSRP Support**

Oracle WebCenter 11*g* is now supported as a WSRP producer. Refer to *Deploying CPS* as a WSRP Producer in the CPS Installation Guide for more information.

The following installation considerations should be taken into account when using this version of CPS:

## Private Patch Required for WebLogic Portal as Producer

This release requires that you download and apply a Private Patch to use WebLogic Portal as producer. You can download this patch using WebLogic Smart Update (requires valid support ID and password). If you do not have a valid support ID and password or are unable to connect to the Smart Update download site, contact Oracle Customer Support.
