## Overview

Please review the enclosed defect documents promptly to establish the impact on your business operations. Oracle Customer Support investigates submitted issues with the assumption that all release patches have been applied. While it is ultimately at the client's discretion as to when to apply patches, delays or lags in their application can complicate the support process. When members of Oracle Customer Support investigate a potential software bug, they assume that you have applied all patches for a given module before the issue was discovered. To assist in the patch review, Oracle Customer Support provides a system-level assessment by assigning a priority. In addition, a cross-reference spreadsheet is provided to assist with this research. This patch contains the 10.1.6 patch release. Before you apply the patch:

- Verify that RPM has been installed up to the previous patch: RPM 10.1.5.
- Verify that RMS has been installed up to the previous patch (unless RPM is deployed as a standalone product). RMS 10.1 users should be current with the RMS 10.1.14 patch.
- Upgrade the OC4J server to 9.0.4 as specified in the install guide.

The RPM 10.1.6 patch contains files that were modified since the previous patch release. For detailed information on what is included regarding software fixes in this patch release, see the patch documentation.

## Applying Source Code

Before applying the patch source files over your code:

- Note whether customizations have been made to the module. If so, the customizations must be reapplied to the new version of the module (or the fix may need to be applied to the custom version of the code).
- Copy the original files to a different directory before you copy over them in case you need to refer to them at a later date.

## Running Scripts

Back up data before running any script. The provided scripts do **not** preserve data. See the defect documentation for details.

## Deploying the rpm.war File

If you have made no customizations to the initial release and wish to accept all modifications that are included in the RPM 10.1.6 patch, you can save time and effort by extracting the rpm.war file. The rpm.war file contains all of the source code you need to run RPM. You will still need to run scripts manually.

Most application servers extract the .war file automatically. Please see your server's documentation for guidance on how to extract the .war file. You may have to modify your server's configuration files. After you extract rpm.war, you will have to modify the db.properties file. You must then restart the server for your changes to take effect.

## Defect Documentation (DEFECT MODULE XREF RPM 10.1.6.xls)

A defect fix is a modification to the base Oracle code (for example, a bug fix, a performance enhancement, or a functional enhancement). Each defect fix that is included in this patch has a corresponding defect document in the \Sir Docs folder titled <defect#>.doc, such as “123456.doc”. There is also a document in that same folder titled “DEFECT MODULE XREF RPM 10.1.6.xls” that lists every defect # and the accompanying modules/scripts that are included in the patch. Each defect document should be fully reviewed before this patch is implemented. Please note that scripts **do not** preserve data. Make sure that all data is backed up prior to running any script.

## Noteworthy RPM Fixes

As mentioned earlier, RPM 10.1.6 includes general product fixes. See the DEFECT MODULE XREF RPM 10.1.6.xls for a complete list of fixes included in the patch. Several noteworthy fixes are described below.

### **Defect 4852278**

Various localization issues have arisen across the application.

### **Defect 395961**

The localization of text on screens is an issue. The text on screen gets corrupted in case of non-ASCII character based language versions of RPM application.

### **Defect 395837**

Approved RPM price changes for items cannot be edited in RMS. When a user tries to edit an approved price change, an error appears on the form stating, “Must enter multi-units retail”.

### **Defect 396666**

When a user is set up in RMS with ‘Limited’ access type and authorization is limited to a few zones for which items exist in RPM pricing worksheet, if the same user logs into RPM, pricing worksheet does not show any items.

### **Defect 398251**

If clearance strategy is used for a department, zone group, or zone and worksheet is populated with price changes, the clearance indicator check box does not default to checked. In the present state, the user must manually select the indicator for all clearance strategy items.

## Known Issues

### **Defect 395961**

On the Candidate Rule screen, if a single candidate rule is created specifying the same field more than once (for example: Department=124 **and** Department=130), RPM does not generate a worksheet.
